

# Kalynn Quinn Hensley Head & Neck/ Laryngology Lectureship

The Kalynn Quinn Hensley Lectureship was established in 2001 to honor the memory of a very dear patient who was cared for by many of the SOHN nurses in Houston, Texas. Kalynn was diagnosed with recurrent respiratory papillomatosis (RRP). She required frequent surgical procedures to maintain her airway. She lost her fight for life in 2000 as a young adult due to pulmonary disease progression to cancer.

## Guidelines for Submission:

The presenter must be a SOHN member or sponsored by a SOHN member.

The presentation may be adult or pediatric oriented and must clearly include nursing implications.

The presentation should focus on at least one of the following:

- ❖ Recurrent respiratory papillomatosis (RRP)
- ❖ Airway problems/management of RRP
- ❖ Innovations in the management of patients with laryngeal papillomatosis
- ❖ Complications of RRP
- ❖ Long term management of the patient with RRP
- ❖ Establishing RRP support groups
- ❖ Role of the nurse in care of the patient with RRP
- ❖ Psychosocial issues of patient with RRP
- ❖ Family centered care approach to the patient with RRP
- ❖ Quality improvement ideas/research in RRP

Must be typed, double-spaced. Submit:

- ❖ Abstract 300 words or less
- ❖ Identify target audience and purpose of the presentation
- ❖ Teaching plan format, include behavioral objective with content/outline, time frame and teaching methods for each objective (*sample will be sent upon request, contact SOHN headquarters*)
- ❖ Biographical data form (*sample available on request also*) or Curriculum Vitae
- ❖ Written copy of presentation for publication in **ORL-Head and Neck Nursing**, the official publication of SOHN

Submit to SOHN Headquarters by **January 31<sup>st</sup>**.

Submissions for the scholarship will be judged by the President, the Head and Neck Special Interest Group leader or designee and a member of the ENT-NF Board of Directors appointed by the President. All reviews will be based on the set criteria.

In the event there are no submissions for this lectureship the National Education Planning Committee will

invite a guest lecturer. Selection of the guest lecturer will be dependent on a submitted outline that supports

the lectureship's purpose and reflects the criteria.
