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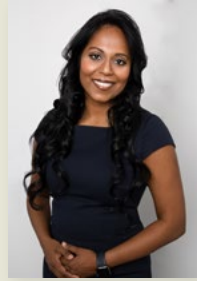
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President's Message

Proposed Bylaws Changes

As stated in the last Update Newsletter, the board is proposing two by-laws change. Below is the proposed language change SOHN Membership will be voting for.

Article III: Section 5: Dues

Accreditation Update

The American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) Accreditation program recognizes the importance of high-quality nursing continuing professional development (NCPD). The Society of Otorhinolaryngology and Head-Neck Nurses, Inc. (SOHN) is accredited as a provider of nursing continuing professional development activities by the ANCC's Commission on Accreditation, signifying those educational activities that award contact hours offered through SOHN meet national standards for high-quality nursing continuing professional development. SOHN has been continuously accredited since our initial American Nurses' Association accreditation in 1980.

SOHN is evaluated by the ANCC every four years to ensure that, as a Provider Unit, we are complying with and adhering to the educational design process and activity file criteria. The educational design process outlined by the ANCC ensures that SOHN's educational activities are planned using evidence-based processes that are outcomes driven. SOHN needs to demonstrate that identifying the professional practice gap, underlying educational need, desired learning outcome(s) and evaluation methods are practices that occur prior to planning of our activity content and logistics.

SOHN will be evaluated by the ANCC this year as we apply for reaccreditation as a provider of nursing continuing professional development. The reaccreditation process is quite vigorous. Under the guidance of our President, Vinciya Pandian, a taskforce of SOHN leaders (Cheryl Brandt, Ann DeLeo, Sharon Jamison, Kristina Keppel, Sandye Schwartz, and Karen Ulmer) been working hard to prepare for our reaccreditation.

The status of our reaccreditation process to date includes submission of the Nursing Activity Reporting System (NARS) report. The NARS report is a comprehensive document that details each educational activity presented by SOHN in a calendar year. SOHN has completed the reaccreditation application and eligibility information on the Primary Accreditation Online Application Review System (PAORS). Vinciya and Karen participated in a Zoom call with a member of the ANCC to gain a better understanding of the reaccreditation process and expectations. The taskforce members have been working since September 2021 in developing SOHN's self-study document; a document that defines the SOHN structural capacity, educational design process and quality outcomes as it relates to our Provider Unit. The ANCC reviewed our 2021 NARS report and selected three-chapter

education activities that will be reviewed as part of our reaccreditation process. The completed self-study and each of the three education activities are being uploaded to the PAORS site.

Following review by the ANCC of our submitted documents, we will take part in the accreditation virtual visit this fall. The virtual visit is an opportunity for SOHN to verify the information presented in the self-study documents and education activities. This is our opportunity to ensure that the appraisers understand our documentation demonstrate why SOHN deserves to continue to be an accredited provider by the ANCC.

Please join me in thanking each member of the accreditation taskforce for their hard work. It is a reflection of our active and engaged membership that SOHN has been able to present high quality education programs these many years.

Education Update – SOHN 36th Annual Spring Seminar

SOHN's 36th Annual Spring Seminar was held as a virtual event April 28th and 29th. To kick off the seminar, a variety of excellent presentations were shown on Pediatric Day. Dr. Steven Goudy MD, MBA, FACS started the day with **Assessment and Management of Pierre Robin Sequence Patients**. Jana Bradley CRNP, CORLN and Mark Rizzi MD next presented **Pediatric Smell and Taste Disorders in the COVID-19 Era**, a timely, comprehensive lecture. For the first time, we offered two lectureships- the 2021 Lois Moore Rogers (LMR) Pediatric Lectureship recipients, Carolyn Kuschel BSN, RN and Bianca Waller BSN, RN, CNOR, who presented **Pediatric Bone Anchored Hearing Devices**; and the 2022 LMR Peds Lectureship awardee, Terri Giordano DNP, CRNP, CORLN, who spoke on **A Novel Approach to Pain Management After Pediatric Tonsillectomy**. Brooke Jaquith CRNP, CORLN, Ashley Williams CRNP, CORLN, and Kellye Jones- HO CRNP, CORLN, related their shared experience with the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) task force at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP). Nina DeSell CRNP gave a fascinating talk on **Airway Obstruction in a Teenager**. Finally, Kaitlyn DaTorre CRNP, AANP, a colleague from the Gastroenterology,

Hepatology, and Nutrition Center of CHOP gave us valuable insight into management of Gastroesophageal Reflux Disorder (GERD).

Friday, April 29th was focused on adult ORL Head and Neck issues. Joseph Califano, MD, an internationally recognized head-neck surgeon who specializes in tumors of the oral cavity, salivary glands, pharynx, larynx, sinuses, thyroid, and skull base, presented **The Next Wave: Second Generation Immunotherapy Approaches for Head and Neck Cancer**. James Sciubba DMD, PhD, world renowned oral and maxillofacial pathologist lectured on **Oral Mucosal Diseases-Clinical Considerations and Features**. Expect to hear more from Dr. Sciubba this fall at the 46th Annual SOHN Congress and Educational Symposia. Melissa Borofsky RN, CORLN, Ajani Keswani MD, MSCI, and Amit Singh, MD gave us a comprehensive presentation on **What Would the Sinus Specialist Do? Rhinology Basics Every ENT Clinicians Should Know**.

WE enjoyed hearing about three unusual case studies from Carol Maragos, MSN, ACNP-BC, CORLN (**NUT Carcinoma**), Melissa Borofsky RN, CORLN (**Hematopoiesis in the Sphenoid Sinus**), and Karen Ulmer MS, RN, CORLN (Paraganglioma). Additionally, we viewed

a panel discussion on **10 Simple Steps to Publishing a Journal Article** with Margie Hickey, MSN, MS, RN, Joan Lockhart PhD, RN, CNE, ANEF-BC, FAAN, Michele Farrington BSN, RN, PMGT- BC, and Maria Colandrea DNP, NP-C, CORLN, FAANP, FFMRCSE, in which they shared easily followed but important steps toward successful publishing.

A short and succinct overview of **Mentorship** by Sharon Jamison, VR-RN, BSN, CORLN outlined the differences- and similarities- of coaching vs. mentoring.

Finally, we received helpful tips and practical applications from **Hearing Healthcare in the Aging Population** by Stephen Bowditch Au.D, MS, CCC-A.

Special Interest Group Meetings Update

SOHN has now been able to offer the rank-and-file membership a total of two extra yearly meetings with the opportunity to attend from one to ten special interests groups that include Facial Plastics, Pediatric, Head and Neck, Otolaryngology, Geriatric, Advanced Practice, Allergy/Sinus, Federal/Military, Perioperative and Office Based Practice. These meetings allowed relaxed and collaborative presentations without overlap and, for the most part, at a convenient time. The meetings held in May allowed for members to clock in a total of 7.5 CEUs outside of Congress and the Spring offerings with no added costs. This big educational plus for SOHN was established by the hard work of the SIG leaders and the vigilance of the Education Committee, especially Karen Ulmer and that of Maureen from Affinity, to make this happen.

Attendance was higher in the January meetings even without the educational

offerings of May, varying from one attendee (less than one percent of the 302 SOHN members), to eleven attendees (3.64%). We hope we can receive feedback from members to pinpoint what had hindered attendance. However, I did meet with a few of the nurses getting their free CEUs during May at several of the presentations and they were glad for these offerings to keep up for their licensure.

The process will be refined with time and there is plenty of room for growth. We are looking at spreading out SIG meetings even more and are hopeful that eventually all SIGS will offer CEUs as well. Nevertheless, we launched additional educational opportunities, never before offered. Each CEU given to a SOHN member for their attendance and feedback is proof that all the hard work paid off!

As I am stepping down from my long tenured position as SIG Clinical Coordinator and Head

and Neck SIG leader and am already making headway in finding replacements for each role. We are also looking to fill the following positions:

- Military/Federal
- Perioperative SIG (now vacant),
- Facial Plastics

I did want to acknowledge Shannon Brady-Powers, who did a stellar job of leading her SIG for 11 years!

Health Policy and Advocacy Committee Update

On April 4, 2022, The U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 1916, the Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act (ELSA). This bill—if passed by the Senate and signed into law—would require private insurance companies and individual health care plans to cover the medically necessary care, including dental care, associated with the treatment of congenital abnormalities, so as to achieve normal body functioning and appearance. Some states already have laws requiring this. If ELSA passes, this important coverage will spread to all 50 states. Cleft lip and/or palate is one of the most common of all birth defects. As ORL nurses, many of us are involved in the care of these patients and their families. How much more could their lives be improved if this bill were to become law? In the Senate,

ELSA is known as S. 754. The bill has been introduced there and referred to their Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions. **Please consider contacting your Senator(s) and ask them to support and/or co-sponsor this bill.** You can go to [Congress.gov](https://www.congress.gov) to learn more.

The global public health world lost one of its most passionate and effective advocates for health equity earlier this year. Dr. Paul Farmer, a co-founder of Partners in Health, died February 21st in Rwanda, working at a hospital and medical university there that he helped to establish. You can learn more about this remarkable man, his life and legacy by conducting a Google search; by reading the book, "Mountains Beyond

Mountains", by Tracy Kidder; or by watching the documentary, "Bending the Arc" on Netflix. I highly recommend that you do all of the above. I promise that you will be humbled and inspired by the life of this remarkable man.

HPAC has met twice this year, holding a virtual meeting in February and April. Our next virtual meeting is scheduled for July 13, 2022 at 7pm ET. Everyone is invited to attend. 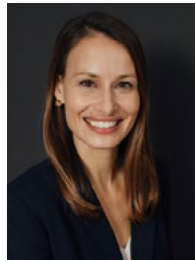
